Do you know a local hero? Do you know someone who has taken a stand against crime? Do you know a young person that has turned their life around? Do you know a group in your community that are working hard to improve lives?

Then nominate now to ensure they are honoured and recognised for the work they have done and for their contribution to making Birmingham one of the safest cities in the country.

The United Streets of Birmingham Community Awards have been created in order to recognise the contribution that local people make to reduce crime in Birmingham. We want to make sure that the people who do stand up get the recognition that they deserve.

By honouring the people who have begun to make a difference, we can encourage others to do the same – and together we can have a huge impact right across the city.

The awards are organised by the Safer Birmingham Partnership. The Safer Birmingham Partnership is a multi-agency organisation that includes West Midlands Police, Birmingham City Council, West Midlands Fire Service, Birmingham Primary Care Trusts, Third Sector Assembly, West Midlands Area Probation Service and a range of other agencies. Safer Birmingham Partnership ensures the delivery of a range of community safety activity which is aimed at making Birmingham even safer.

Who can I nominate?

They could be a parent, a relative, a neighbour or friend, a City Council employee, a police officer, a police community support officer, a street warden, a youth worker, a teacher, a fire fighter, a school or a youth group – as long as they live or work in Birmingham.

You can nominate individuals (young people or adults) and groups who have transformed their communities in the following categories:

- **Working Together** ——— neighbours, or a local partnership of organisations
- **Citizen Award** ——— local heroes
- **Inspiring Young People** ——— helping young people make a change, young person up to 21yrs
- **Innovation** ——— a creative solution to a community safety issue
- **Above and Beyond** ——— employees, Police, Council etc, that have gone that extra mile
- **Taking A Stand** ——— people that have stood up against antisocial behaviour

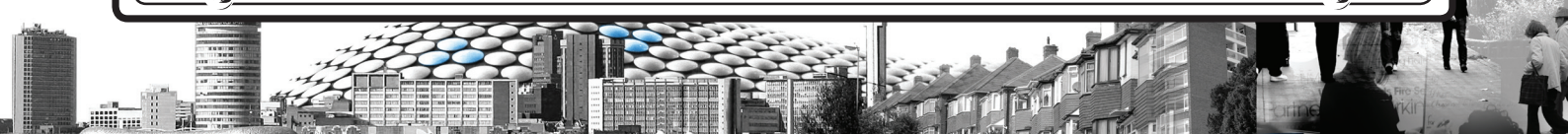
